## What is Horizon 2020?

- Your access to European research and innovation



## Horizon 2020 is open to the world!

- The EU Framework Programme for Research & Innovation
- The biggest multinational programme of its kind with a budget of almost € 80 billion
- Horizon 2020 welcomes researchers & institutions, public or private, from all over the world

## Encouraging international cooperation 1

### Horizon 2020 offers opportunities for

---

- **Collaborative research & innovation projects:** carried out by consortia of organisations working together on specific research & innovation areas. A consortium must include at least 3 participants from 3 different EU Member States or Associated countries. In addition to these three partners, any legal entity from anywhere in the world can be included in the consortium.
- **Individual researcher projects:** The [European Research Council](#) and the [Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions](#) offer unparalleled funding opportunities for individual researchers who want to work in Europe.

## Encouraging international cooperation 2

### Automatically eligible for funding

- **Associated countries** - they participate in Horizon 2020 under the same conditions as EU Member States. There are, as of 7 November 2016, [sixteen countries associated to Horizon 2020](#).

For the Euratom programme, associated countries are as follows:

- **Developing countries** - Research organisations in some 130 developing countries are automatically eligible for funding. The full list of these countries is provided in [Annex A of the Horizon 2020 Work Programmes](#). Please note that this rule does not apply to the Euratom programme.

### Not automatically eligible for funding

- **Industrialised countries and emerging economies** - participants from these countries have themselves to determine the sources of funding and find the resources for their part of the action. Several countries have created mechanisms to co-fund their participants in Horizon 2020 actions selected for EU funding (you can find more information on [available local support from non-EU countries for Horizon 2020 country by country](#) below).

In exceptional circumstances, industrialised and emerging economies can receive EU funding if:

- there is a **bilateral agreement** between that country and the EU
- the country is **explicitly identified in the relevant work programme and call for proposal** as being eligible for funding
- their **participation is deemed by the European Commission to be essential** for carrying out the action.

**Individual researchers** from any country in the world seeking the opportunity to work in Europe for a certain period of their career can apply for funding through the [European Research Council](#) and the [Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions](#).

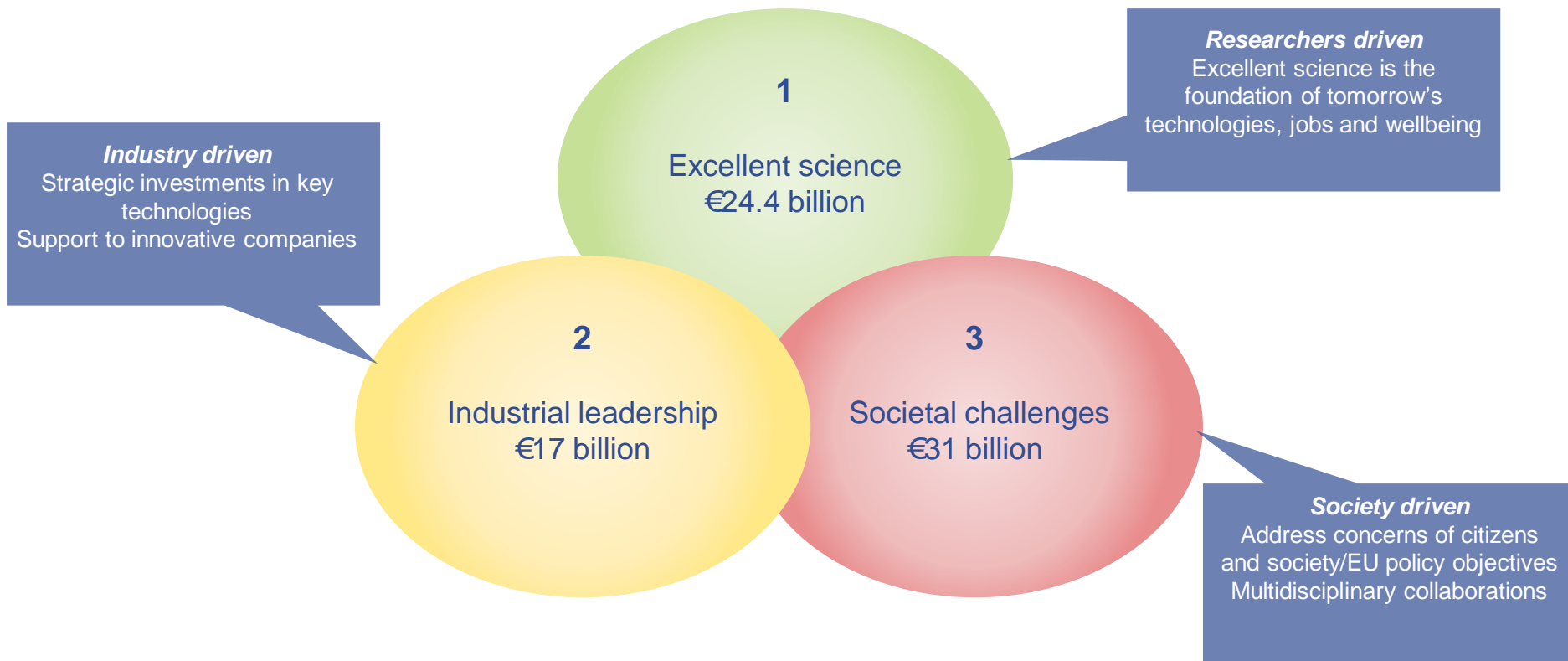

1. **From Research to Innovation** – from basic research to bringing ideas to the market!
  - Strong emphasis on industry participation across the Programme
2. **Multi- disciplinary** approach to research
  - Integration of SSH disciplines in calls
3. **‘Simplification’**
  - ‘As is’ approach to evaluation process – no opportunity to tidy-up proposal at negotiation stage (consider: IPR, access rights, management structure)
  - Less descriptive calls

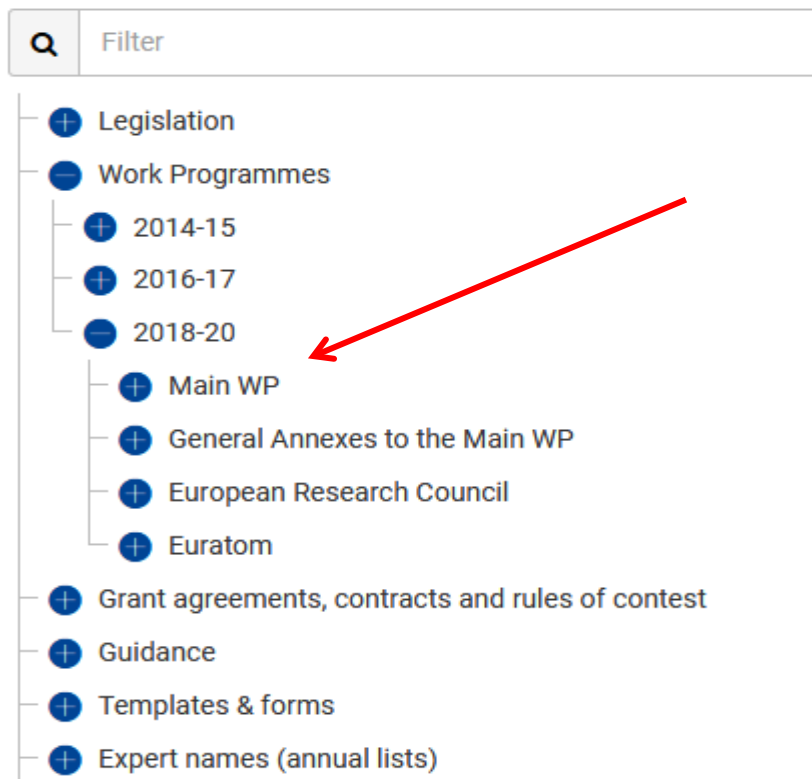

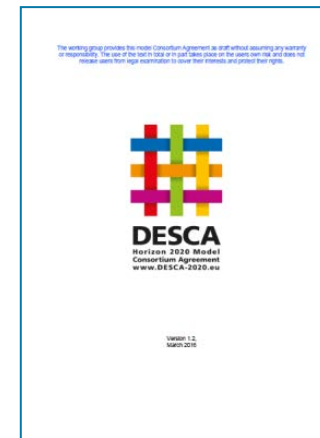

### NOTICE

Please note that until the UK leaves the EU, EU law continues to apply to and within the UK, when it comes to rights and obligations; this includes the eligibility of UK legal entities to fully participate and receive funding in Horizon 2020 actions such as those called for in this work programme. Please be aware however that the eligibility criteria must be complied with for the entire duration of the grant. If the UK withdraws from the EU during the grant period without concluding an agreement with the EU ensuring in particular that British applicants continue to be eligible, they will no longer be eligible to receive EU funding and their participation may be terminated on the basis of Article 50 of the grant agreement.

## Research and Innovation Actions (RIA)

=>What? Funding available for collaborative research projects tackling clearly defined challenges which can lead to the development of new knowledge or new technology.

=>Who? Consortia of partners from different countries, industry and academia. Min. 3 legal entities established in 3 Member States or Associated Countries.

## Innovation Actions (IA)

=>What? Funding available for closer-to-the-market activities including prototyping, testing, demonstrating, piloting, scaling-up etc. for new or improved products, processes or services.

=>Who? Consortia of partners from different countries, industry and academia. Min. 3 legal entities established in 3 Member States or Associated Countries.

## Coordination and Support Action (CSA)

What? Funding available for actions consisting primarily of accompanying measures, such as the coordination and networking of research and innovation projects, programmes and policies (e.g. training, dissemination, exploitation, standardization, policy dialogues, etc.). Funding for research and innovation per se not covered.

Who? Single entities or consortia of partners from different countries, industry and academia. Min. 1 legal entity established in 1 Member State or Associated Country.

## Profile of your institution/organisation/company

### 2 PAGES ONLY!

Provide targeted information about your institution:

- ✓ a **description of the your institution and your competences** with an explanation of how its profile matches the tasks in the proposal (**half page limit**)
- ✓ **CVs** of the persons, including their gender, who will be primarily responsible for carrying out the proposed research and/or innovation activities; (**6 lines maximum**)
- ✓ a **list of up to 5 relevant publications, and/or products, services** or other achievements relevant to the call content;
- ✓ a **list of up to 5 relevant previous projects or activities**, connected to the subject of this proposal;
- ✓ a description of any **significant infrastructure and/or any major items of technical equipment, relevant to the proposed work**;
- ✓ **Include your logo**
- ✓ **Contact details of your institutions (Name in English/national language, Acronym/ PIC number, full address, contact details (including email, phone...))**
